Reporting to the Program Manager, the Registered Masters prepared Social Worker will be experienced in providing assessments, counseling, and community resources and linkages. As a member of an interdisciplinary team working within the Child and Family Mental Health Program, you will be providing treatment to children and adolescents (and their families) with Serious Mental Health problems who have impaired functioning.

The incumbent will be expected to work in a high paced environment, providing crisis consultation, psychosocial assessments and the appropriate interventions in responding to the unique and complex needs of each client and their families.

Advanced Family, individual and group therapy skills are required as well as a good working knowledge and ability to link with other service providers in the hospital and community. Preference will be given to candidates with an advanced knowledge of CBT for anxiety, OCD and mood disorders.

Experience working in a hospital or clinical setting is an asset.

In order to meet the needs of the program and clients some evening work may be required.

The Social Worker is also expected to contribute to program development and continuous quality improvement and organize and collaborate in the planning and implementation of social work best practices within interdisciplinary team environment.
