## POSITION TTG AS A LEADER ON ISSUES RELATED TO CHILDREN AND FAMILIES AFFECTED BY HIV

The "How Do I Tell My Kids?" booklet on HIV disclosure to children is available online in both English and French and has been extremely well received by parents and our community partners across Canada and in other parts of the world. Work on an accompanying toolkit has begun — watch out for new resources in the near future.

The Teresa Group staff shared lessons learned and information about the impact of our programs at three conferences — CAHR in Vancouver, OHTN Endgame in Toronto and the International AIDS Conference in Amsterdam. This included two oral presentations, three posters and a workshop.

Over the past year we have embarked on a number of advocacy initiatives to address government policy changes and program cuts that deeply affect the children and families we serve. These include the significant impact of changes to the sex-ed curriculum in schools, cuts to autism funding and deep cuts to education in general. Other areas affecting our community include harm reduction, ODSP and a broad range of social services. Some good news on the federal front was the strik-

ing down of the "10% rule" which now allows charities greater freedom to advocate for their affected communities.

Research: This year, The Teresa Group has become engaged in several new research projects.

## PROVIDE TARGETED UNIQUE AND HIGH-QUALITY PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

We continue to provide a broad range of care and support programs and services for children of all ages and their parents. Participant feedback has vital to our development and has led to program growth and development. Demand for practical supports continues to grow and engagement in parent support groups has increased.

**Practical supports** - monthly grocery cards and transit tokens, diapers for kids up to 2yrs, new and gently used clothing; emergency food bank; "Back to School" new backpacks and supplies; "Welcome Home Baby" bags for all new infants; holiday gifts for children and families.

**Counselling** — individual, family, couples, children and teens, by phone or in person

Case management and referral to supplementary and specialized services

"Leading the Way" therapeutic groups for teens 15-18 years and for children 6-10 years

**Moms' Group** monthly mutual aid support group for Moms with new babies/toddlers

**Parent Club** monthly mutual aid support group for parents of children of any age

**Prenatal Classes** groups for pregnant women living with HIV **Scholarships** financial support for young people entering tertiary education

**Summer Camp** a week-long wilderness camp experience for children aged 9-14 years and a Counsellor-in-Training program for teens aged 15-18 years

**Advisory Committee** quarterly meetings to guide the workplan supported through a grant from the Public Health Agency of Canada Community Action Fund

**Infant Formula Program** a Province-wide program to supply infant formula to all babies born to Moms living with HIV

SickKids Hospital: The Teresa Group social work staff work in the outpatient clinic twice a week




